Coorabell Film Club Wednesday 2 August Bicycle Thieves

Food & Drinks (Licensed) at 6.00 Film starts at 7.30

This 1948 Italian neorealist drama, directed by Vittorio De Sica, follows the story of a poor father searching in post-World War II Rome for his stolen bicycle. Without his bicycle he will lose the job which is to be the salvation of his young family. Starring Lamberto Maggiorani as the desperate father and Enzo Staiola as his plucky young son, Bicycle Thieves received an Academy Honorary Award (most outstanding foreign language film) in 1950, and in 1952 was deemed the greatest film of all time by Sight & Sound magazine's poll of filmmakers and critics. Fifty years later another poll organized by the same magazine ranked it sixth among the greatest-ever films.




TALES AS OLD AS TIME
